Timed activities

6.30-6.50pm and 7.00-7.20pm - Meet the curators: find some of the team behind Beyond the Binary in the exhibition space (Ground Floor, exhibition space)

6.30pm - Drag Queen Story Corner: Asifa Lahore, Britain's first out Muslim drag queen, has recorded a selection of stories celebrating diverse families specially for Beyond the Binary and Sassify Zine (Old Library, Ground Floor)

6.45pm and 7.30pm - Object talk: meet community partner, Beth Asbury, and discover the unexpected link between the museum's founder, General Pitt-Rivers, and queer history (*Top Floor, far left corner of the gallery*)
